Motion #139-18: Mr. Currens made a motion to purchase 5 additional sets of turnout gear for the fire department at a cost of approximately \$11,000, seconded by Mr. Orewiler and upon a roll call vote all members voted "AYE".

Dennis Gast will be off until at least November due to spinal surgery. Lt. Kinney will also be off until at least November for a knee injury.

Motion #140-18: Mr. Orewiler made a motion to enter into a training agreement with Jordan Bittner for him to attend Firefighter II class at Delaware Career Center for \$2,600, seconded by Mr. Gleisinger and upon a roll call vote all members voted "AYE". This is reimbursable training through the fire marshal's annual training grant.

The following major expenses were approved: E-23 power steering cylinder and drag links for \$1,987 and L-23 EGR valve replacement for \$1,885.

On August 15-16th there will be a large scale active shooter and mass casualty drill with multiple law enforcement and mutual aid Fire/EMS agencies at OMS/OHS.

On August 20th STFD will be assisting with CPR and Stop the Bleed training for the entire Ontario schools staff.

A BWC grant of \$4,616 for a gear washer was awarded to the fire department. The Board agreed to pay STFD's obligated cost of \$923. The washer will be installed at St#1.

The Board discussed additional concrete for patio area between building and new generator at St#1 at \$800. They decided to offer Jim Herrick \$600 to do the additional concrete.

Mr. Orewiler mentioned how he has heard on the radio when area townships receive grants and thought it was a great idea and that it would be a good idea for us to do the same to shed some positive light on the township. The Board discussed maybe doing a yearly article with everything that was accomplished by the township.

Mr. Orewiler has received complaints from residents regarding the speed limit on Rock Road. He went to regional planning to inform them of the complaints and to see what they could do.

Mr. Orewiler is adding the residence of Joyce Wells, 2010 State Route 39, to the list for being demolished.

Mr. Orewiler discussed submitting an article he read regarding EMS billing to the Ontario Village Council members.

The Chip and Seal project has been completed as well as the 2nd round of mowing.

Mr. Gleisinger updated the Board on the Wiles Estate issues regarding trash/trespassing issue therein. The owners would like stop signs placed on the road. The Board discussed possibly putting up a gate or barricade it as long as the owners are in agreement.

A Frey Road resident was putting up a fence that caused a zoning issue. The resident did remove the post once he was made aware of the violation.

The Board agreed on a logo for the township and discussed any other changes that could be made to the township website.

A pedestrian crossing will be put at Lexington-Springmill and State Route 309. There will also be changes at the ramps on State Route 309 and West 4th Street.

Mr. Currens received a call from the Health Department regarding 1065 Walcrest. The pool is covered and vines have been cut down. They have met the requirements to be in good standing with the Health Department.

Marilyn John and Rachel Stephens from Central Purchasing will be at the August 27th meeting to discuss possible hooking up with the county on central purchasing contracts.

The Township's Consumer Life Insurance will be renewed on October 1, 2018.

The Board signed the July Management reports.

The Public Hearings to approve the Electric Aggregation Operation of Governance has been changed from 1:00pm and 6:15pm to 10:00am and 6:15pm on August 27th.

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FO Kochheiser updated the Board on First Energy money for the aggregation program.

FO Kochheiser informed the Board that we have received a renewal of the Township's Ohio Plan Insurance.

The township received their 2nd half real estate tax collection for 2018.

Public Comment:

Craig Hunt asked how the trustees' salaries were established. They are based on population and done by the state. He also asked if anything was done on the salt bin. It is supposed to be done by October.

Joe Smith asked if we could look into getting with the city and getting some of their funds since our trucks service the city. As a township, there are only certain ways that we can receive funds.

Motion #141-18: Mr. Currens made a motion to go to Executive Session at 8:45pm to discuss employee promotion/compensation. Mr. Gleisinger seconded the motion and upon a roll call all members voted "AYE".

Motion #142-18: Mr. Orewiler moved to return to regular session at 9:40pm, Mr. Currens seconded and upon a roll call all members voted "AYE".

Motion #143-18: There being no further business to come before the Board, Mr. Orewiler made a motion to adjourn, seconded by Mr. Currens, motion carried.
