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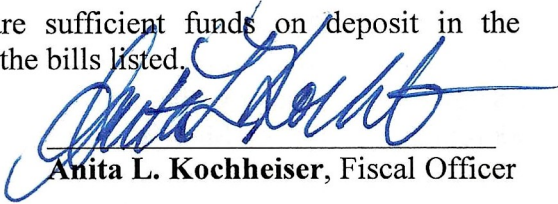

Present: Craig Hunt, Ellen Meredith, AC Shelton, Nathan Volz, Tate Moyer, Angelo Tino, and Amanda Hike.

Tate Moyer addressed the Board about his concern for his neighbor Rocky. The Sheriff's department has been to his house every 7-10 days for wellness checks, three times he has been picked up for sleeping in the road and taken to hospital, and he climbs on his roof to get into his house every day. He also was riding his brand-new ATV on the highway and was picked up by the highway patrol who brought him home. Trustee Orewiler has been to Rocky's

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house 10 times and hasn't been able to find him. Trustee Gleisinger commented that every agency that has the authority to do something has been called and when they check up on him, they don't see anything that will allow them to do anything. Trustee Orewiler called Adult Protective Services and was informed the house could be condemned. Tate added that the house has no running water, sewer, or electricity. FO Kochheiser believes Adult Protective Services are totally dropping the ball since he is 84 years old and this is their job to handle and if he isn't getting help then ask to talk to the supervisor. Trustee Gleisinger added it is out of our authority to do anything except for mowing the yard and assessing his taxes. When the grass needs mowed the township can send him a letter and if he does not mow the yard the township will mow and assess his taxes. Trustee Orewiler assured Tate that this is one of the things we are going to do and will get with Adult Protective Services again.

Chief Spellman presented the Board with an activity report for August. The Fire Department gave mutual aid to Crestline, Madison, and Troy, and received mutual aid from Madison. There were 2 significant calls and the Fire Inspector collected \$2,375 with \$3,765 billed.

Chief Spellman was able to get \$13,266 deducted from the original quote for three heart monitors from Stryker. He removed the printers and if they decide later down the road to get them, they can do so because the printers are plug and play. He also removed the pediatric pulse ox because they do not need a reusable one, they could always use the disposable version. The new monitors have upgraded technology, and paramedics can see everything on the screen with diagnosis. The monitors use see through technology and show underlying rhythm without stopping compressions and will let the paramedics know if they need to shock the patient and whether there is fresh blood in the heart or old. Stryker will give the township max trade in price for the old monitors of \$24,000 and a price increase is coming soon. The township could potentially use opioid money of \$11,000 toward the monitors, they have not got back to Chief Spellman yet to confirm, however other departments have used opioid funds toward monitors successfully. The new price minus trade-ins and deductions would be \$154,977.72.

Motion #143-2025: Trustee Daugherty made a motion to order three new Stryker Heart Monitors for a total of \$154,977.22 with trading in old monitors for a credit of \$24,000 and half of the funds being paid out of the general fund and the other half out of the Fire Department Fund, seconded by Trustee Orewiler, and upon a roll call vote all members voted "Aye".

Trustee Gleisinger updated the Board on the Road Department. The Road Department and Trustee Gleisinger have discussed the driveway at the north end of the Road Department where the drive is broken up. Charlie inspected the drive and the front part is concrete. He believes the other part of the drive should be concrete as well. He obtained a quote from Armstrong Construction LTD, and a quote from Ohio Concrete Specialists LLC. Trustee Daugherty informed Trustee Gleisinger that the two quotes contain different footage. Trustee Daugherty suggested asking for a quote from Amcrete and bring it back to the next meeting. Trustee Gleisinger will give the quotes back to the Road Department and bring them back to the next meeting.

Trustee Gleisinger informed the Board that Kokosing had started paving Alta West Rd. and we had to stop them as they were not going to put in butt joints and were going to feather it out instead. The bid specs did not contain a line item for butt joints so the township will have to do a change order to include butt joints at a cost of \$4,012.00. Trustee Gleisinger recommends doing the butt joints to get a better job done. Also, striping was not included because the township was going to do the striping with the chip and seal next year. Trustee Gleisinger looked on the internet for guidance and found that it was at the preference of the county whether to put striping on the road. Trustee Daugherty

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advised the Board that if a road has been striped before it must be continually stripped. Trustee Gleisinger will gather information on adding striping to the order.

Motion #144-2025: Trustee Gleisinger made a motion to approve a change order for the Kokosing Bid Project to include butt joints at a cost of \$4,012.00, seconded by Trustee Orewiler, and upon a roll call vote all members voted "Aye".

Trustee Gleisinger informed the Board that every year the township makes a resolution to recognize storm water awareness week.

Resolution #145-2025: Trustee Gleisinger made a resolution to make October 1, 2025-October 7, 2025 Stormwater Awareness Week whereas urban stormwater runoff impacts water quality in the Rocky Fork, Black Fork, Clear Fork, and Sandusky Watersheds in Springfield Township, Richland County, Ohio and whereas population growth, residential, and commercial development, and the resulting changes to the landscape will only increase stormwater quality and quantity concerns throughout Ohio, and whereas these impacts cannot be entirely avoided or eliminated but can be minimized, and whereas it is currently recognized that control of stormwater quantity and quality is most effectively implemented when people and organizations understand the related causes and consequences of polluted stormwater runoff and flooding and the actions they can take to control these and whereas the need arises not only from the regulatory requirements of EPA General Construction and Municipal Stormwater rules, but also from the recognition that citizens and local decision makers will benefit from a greater awareness of how the cumulative impacts of decisions at home, at work, and through local policies impact our water quality, stream corridors and flooding, and whereas the development and implementation of effective, outcomes-based stormwater education and outreach programs will meet the related federal stormwater pollution control requirements and those of the communities they serve so that Ohio continues to be a great place to live, work, and play now therefore be it resolved that Springfield Township joins Richland Soil and Water Conservation District and Communities across Ohio in recognizing Stormwater Awareness Week, seconded by Trustee Orewiler, and upon a roll call vote all members voted "Aye".

Trustee Daugherty should have information for the Board from Sourcewell for the next meeting. They are currently working on gathering information.

FO Kochheiser presented the Board with the August Management Reports for Board approval that she emailed to them last week. Board approved and signed.
