1. Run volume & patterns: **460 runs 3rd qtr 2018***

>>>> comparison >> 521 runs 3rd qtr 2017
485 runs 3rd qtr 2016

*Even though 3rd quarter was slower than last two years, overall runs for 2018 will still be higher than previous years

Major incidents:

- Very few *major* incidents in 2nd quarter, mostly normal EMS calls
- Calls broke down by incident type, p.3 & 4 of this report

2. Station maintenance:

a) Fire alarm system repairs, both stations (\$525)

3. Vehicle maintenance, major:

- a) Holmotro rescue tools annual maint., repairs (\$1,100)
- b) Annual pump tests, all passed
- c) Eng 23 power steering cylinder & drag links (\$929)
- d) Ladder 23, two rear tires, Smetz's Tire Center (\$968)
- e) Ladder 23, replace defective aerial nozzle control motor (\$588)
- f) Ladder 23, replace EGR valve (\$1,885)
- g) Squad 21 front & rear brakes, all new calipers (\$2,400)
- h) Squad 21 new rear tires (\$1,320)
- i) EMS 22 rear brake job (\$750)

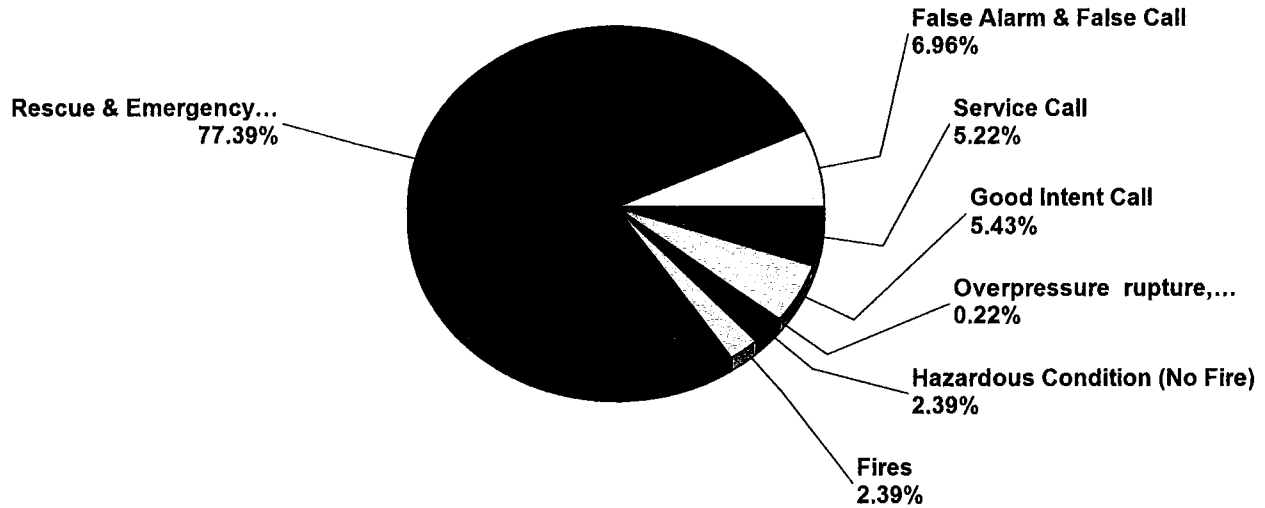
